





UK Reuse Infrastructure Modelling

- Industry consensus, backed by research shows the key to scalability for reuse is a level of standardisation and the use of shared infrastructure to manage the necessary washing, cleaning and logistics of reusable packaging.
- However, there is no overall vision as to what this infrastructure would look like, how much it would cost, what job benefits it could bring or the impact on the current system.
